Provider Self-Service is an online program that is used to help manage your everyday work and establish what a customer sees about you. It can help you:

- View Pennsylvania child care laws and regulations
- Manage your child care certifications (new applications and renewals)
- View and update your profile
- View and print child care forms and information
- Manage and submit attendance invoices online (regulated child care providers only)

What is my profile?

Providers who have a Provider Self-Service account have a profile that has information about services delivered at the child care location. Parents looking for a child care provider or early learning program count on this information to be accurate and complete.

This profile information includes:

- Care levels served
- Hours of operation
- General schedules offered
- Private pay rates
- Transportation offered
- Website

If your profile is incomplete or incorrect, you could lose business.
